UNAS FEST 2025

The Universitas Nasional Festival (UNAS FEST) has been an annual tradition since 2021 as part of the Universitas Nasional Anniversary celebration. UNAS FEST activities present various scientific and creative competitions involving students from multiple universities. There are several activities in UNAS FEST 2025, such as English Debate Competition (EDC), *Kompetisi Debat Bahasa Indonesia* (KDBI), Scientific Paper Competition (SPC), and Digital Content Competition (DCC).

“Conducting a Preventive Action for Deforestation Through AI-Assisted Technology Innovation in Acquiring a Resilience and Sustainable Ecosystem” becomes the theme raised in UNAS FEST 2025 activities and is highly relevant to current global issues, namely, deforestation and the utilization of Artificial Intelligence (AI)-assisted technology in realizing a resilient and sustainable ecosystem. With awareness of this issue, UNAS FEST aims to encourage students to not only understand the urgency of environmental issues but also take an active role in offering innovative solutions based on technology. Through a series of educational and competitive events, UNAS FEST 2025 is expected to be a platform for the younger generation to sharpen their critical thinking skills, communicate effectively, and grow their awareness of global ecological sustainability.

One of the events that will be held at UNAS FEST 2025 is the **English Debate Competition (EDC)**, which is held nationally and open to various universities across Indonesia. EDC UNAS FEST 2025 is an event for undergraduate students to express their views on a predetermined theme, as well as demonstrate their ability to understand and engage with the issue. In addition to testing comprehension, this competition also encourages students to think critically, articulate ideas logically, and refine their debating skills in a convincing and structured manner.



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BACKGROUND

In recent years, deforestation has become a growing concern around the world, including in Indonesia. According to data from the Ministry of Environment and Forestry (KLHK), Indonesia's tropical rainforest area spans approximately 126 million hectares, covering around 59% of Indonesia's total land area and approximately 10% of the world's tropical forest area. This makes Indonesia the third-largest tropical forest country in the world after Brazil and the Congo. However, Indonesia continues to experience a decline in forest area due to various human activities, ranging from land clearing for oil palm plantations, infrastructure projects, and mining to illegal logging that has not yet been fully controlled. One of the issues that has been widely discussed is the plan to expand nickel mining in the Raja Ampat Islands, West Papua Province, Indonesia. This area is recognized as one of the world's marine biodiversity hotspots and has a tropical forest ecosystem vital for maintaining the balance of nature. If the mining expansion proceeds, it raises serious concerns about environmental damage and deforestation that will not only affect the land but also the marine ecosystem.

Nickel mining has the potential to degrade tropical rainforests, pollute soil and water, and damage coral reefs in surrounding waters. It also threatens important ecosystems that serve as habitats for endemic species such as the bird of paradise and tree kangaroos. Furthermore, forest conversion into industrial mining zones leads to the loss of natural vegetation cover, increased carbon emissions, reduced water absorption, and weakened protection against natural disasters—all of which directly affect the surrounding communities. Indigenous peoples who have long lived in harmony with nature may lose their ancestral lands, livelihoods, and cultural heritage. In the long term, these impacts could worsen the national environmental crisis, accelerate climate change, and hinder Indonesia's commitment to sustainable development.

BACKGROUND

Meanwhile, rapid technological advancements, including Artificial Intelligence (AI), offer new solutions to address environmental challenges. As we enter the Industry 4.0 era, AI technology enables smarter, more efficient, and sustainable approaches to environmental issues. AI can be used to monitor land cover changes in real-time and detect illegal activities, thus strengthening preventive efforts against deforestation and enhancing surveillance capabilities. Despite its potential, the implementation of AI technology in Indonesia remains limited due to constraints in policy and practical application. Without proactive steps from the government and industry to integrate AI into environmental planning and monitoring, its potential will remain underutilized.

In light of this urgency, the Universitas Nasional Festival 2025, in conjunction with the 76th anniversary of Universitas Nasional (UNAS), is organizing the **English Debate Competition (EDC)** with the theme **“Conducting a Preventive Action for Deforestation Through AI-Assisted Technology Innovation in Acquiring a Resilience and Sustainable Ecosystem.”** This theme not only reflects the real environmental challenges faced by Indonesia but also emphasizes the critical role of youth in voicing and formulating technology-based solutions. The EDC UNAS FEST 2025 is open to 24 teams from public and private universities registered with the Ministry of Education and Culture’s Directorate of Science and Technology. The competition will be held online via Zoom Meeting for the Technical Meeting, Preliminary Round, Semifinals, and Finals, while the Awarding Ceremony will be conducted on-site.

Through the English Debate Competition (EDC) UNAS FEST 2025, it is hoped that participants will have a space to explore the role of AI in environmental preservation and develop ideas that are concrete, relevant, and applicable. This competition is expected to generate innovative solutions that not only aim to reduce deforestation but also promote environmentally friendly policies and encourage public participation in building a greener, fairer, and more sustainable ecosystem.

MAIN THEME OF THE EVENT

Universitas Nasional Festival (UNAS FEST) 2025 will take the theme **"Conducting a Preventive Action for Deforestation Through AI-Assisted Technology Innovation in Acquiring a Resilience and Sustainable Ecosystem,"** which has been formulated and discussed jointly by the entire UNAS FEST committee and the UNAS Student and Alumni Administration Bureau.

PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVE

The purpose of this activity is to provide a space for students to express and convey their ideas and thoughts on current issues. In addition, this activity aims to improve students' ability to convey ideas through speaking, listening, and critical thinking skills in English, thereby serving as a means of developing oral and written communication skills for students interested in this field. Overall, this competition also aims to raise students' awareness of various current issues relevant to the times. The target audience for the English Debate Competition (EDC) UNAS FEST 2025 is undergraduate students from public universities (PTN) or private universities (PTS) across Indonesia.



RULES AND REGULATIONS

1.1 REGULATIONS FOR PARTICIPANTS

1. Participants are active undergraduate students listed in PDDikti (Pangkalan Data Pendidikan Tinggi) from any public or private university in Indonesia, from any study program.
2. Each team must consist of 2 individuals (the team can be all male, all female, or mixed).
3. Participants must come from the same university, but they can be from different study programs, faculties, or semesters.
4. Participants must register through the registration link provided on the UNAS FEST 2025 website.
5. Participants must follow the rules stated in the EDC UNAS FEST 2025 activity guidebook.
6. Each team must create a team name that matches the theme of UNAS FEST 2025 and does not contain elements of ethnicity, religion, race, or intergroup (SARA) discrimination.
7. If a team has already paid the registration fee and later cancels their participation, the fee cannot be refunded.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1.2 UNAS FEST 2025 EDC TERMS OF CONDUCT

1. Participants are required to attend the Zoom Meeting on time. A maximum lateness tolerance of 15 (fifteen) minutes from the scheduled time will be allowed.
2. Participants are required to use 2 (two) devices during the competition:
 - The first device is used for the speaker, and the second device is used for whole-competition monitoring to prevent cheating.
 - On the second device, the camera must be positioned from a side angle to monitor the participant and prevent cheating.
3. Participants are required to use their account names on two devices in the following format: **[Team Name] – [Participant Name] – [Position]**, for example: **[DCD] – [Patrick] – [OO]**.
4. Participants are required to wear neat and formal clothing and wear their campus alma mater during the competition.
5. The camera is supposed to be turned on from entering the Main Room of the Zoom Meeting until the entire session is over, with adequate lighting, and the position of the face is clearly visible to the judges and other participants.
6. The Zoom background must use the official virtual background from the organising committee. Participants are prohibited from using face filters or backgrounds that interfere with concentration.
7. The microphone is required to be mute when it is another participant's turn to speak, except when providing Points of Information (POI) or when asked to speak by the adjudicators or committee.
8. Ensure that the internet connection is stable and the device is ready before the competition begins to avoid unwanted technical disruptions. Delays or disconnections due to participant negligence are personal responsibility.



RULES AND REGULATIONS

9. The Position Release session is conducted in the Main Room. Participants must immediately enter the Breakout Room according to the committee's instructions to begin the competition in the British Parliamentary System format.
10. Participants then enter the Breakout Room for Motion Release and Case Building for 15 minutes, and during this session, participants may only communicate with teammates. Using other communication devices or platforms is prohibited.
11. The speaking duration is 7 minutes, with a maximum tolerance of 20 seconds.
12. POIs can only be given between 1:00 and 6:00, with a maximum duration of 15 seconds. POI beyond that time may be cut by the adjudicators or the committee.
13. Participants are required to use proper and correct English while presenting their arguments or aspirations throughout the competition.
14. Participants are required to maintain politeness in speaking, not use abusive language, not attack personally, and maintain sportsmanship.
15. Participants are prohibited from opening external notes, accessing other tabs on the device, using additional communication tools, or interacting with external parties during the competition.
16. Participants are required to return to the Main Room to receive the results of the competition, briefing, or further instructions from the committee before leaving the Zoom Meeting platform.
17. Accommodation, transportation, and meals are at the participants' own expense.
18. Each participant must comply with all committee directions and adjudicator decisions, which are final and inviolable. It is considered a violation of ethics to publicly challenge a decision.
19. Violation of these rules will be subject to sanctions, according to the classification and applicable provisions in the official rules of EDC UNAS FEST 2025.

1.3 COMPETITION MECHANISM

The British Parliamentary system is a competitive debating format that is considered one of the most prestigious and challenging formats in international debating. The format originates from the British parliamentary tradition and has been widely adopted in debating competitions around the world, including the World Universities Debating Championship (WUDC).

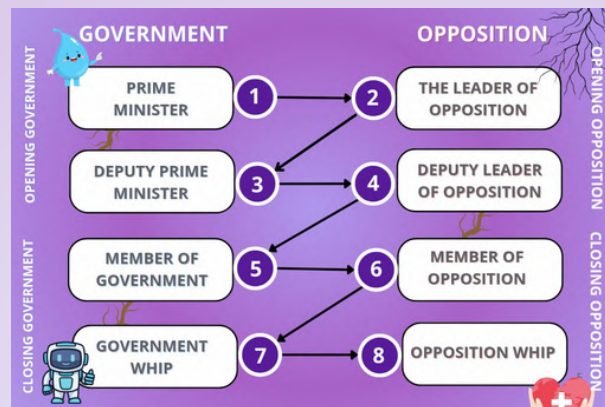


Image 1.3 British Parliamentary System Flow

Debater

- 1 debate room consists of 4 teams, each team consists of 2 people.
- There are a total of 8 speakers in one debate session.
- Each team will be randomly assigned one of the following positions:
 - Opening Government
 - Opening Opposition
 - Closing Government
 - Closing Opposition
- Each participant is given a maximum of **7 minutes** to convey their arguments or opinions. After the main time runs out, a **20-second compensation time is provided** to complete the closing sentence. Exceeding the time limit will be stopped by the moderator without exception.

Motion

Motions are generally used in the context of formal debates or negotiations. Debate motions in this system are impromptu, that is, the motion is given before the debate begins. Each team has time to prepare arguments (Case-Building) for 15 minutes after the motion is released.

1. RULES AND REGULATIONS

Point of Information

Interruption in debate is the act of cutting off or temporarily stopping the opponent's speech to deliver a point of information, clarification, or rebuttal. Interruption is a dynamic element that makes debates more lively and interactive. The time to receive interruptions (POI) starts from 01.00–06.00; after that minute you cannot receive interruptions. With a maximum interruption duration of 15 seconds, during the interruption, the debate time will continue to run. The interruptions made will not be limited in number, and participants have the right to accept & reject interruptions.

1.4 Scoring Parameters

Assessment in the English Debate Competition (EDC) UNAS FEST 2025 consists of 2 types of assessment and several systems, as follows:

- a) Verbal Adjudication : Verbal explanation from the judge after the debate concludes. It includes the evaluation and ranking of the debate results, the reasoning behind the assessment and ranking of each team, as well as the strengths and weaknesses of each team's arguments.
- b) Silent Round : A debate round without immediate result announcement and without verbal adjudication after the debate concludes.
- c) Reset Point : A system in which cumulative points from the preliminary rounds are not carried over to the next stage (final round). After a reset, all teams advancing to the final round start again from zero, and only the results from this final round determine the winner.

Scoring parameters are the scores obtained by each individual based on the arguments presented

1.5 REGISTRATION FLOW

1. Participants register through the Caturnawa website link or Google Form listed on the flyer and social media UNAS FEST 2025.

1) Access Official Website

Open the official Caturnawa 2025 website, which can also be reached from the main UNAS FEST 2025 website.

2) Create an Account

Only one person per team (the leader) needs to create an account. The team leader must fill out the personal data form to register the team.

3) Login & Registration Guide

After creating an account, participants can log in right away without waiting for admin verification. On the main page, they can see the step-by-step guide and a registration simulation video.

4) Browse Competitions

Participants can check all available competitions, along with descriptions, rules, registration fees, and the number of registered teams.

5) Register for a Competition

Once a competition is chosen, click the "Register" button on that competition page.

6) Fill Out the Registration Form

Complete the form with team details and other requirements (e.g., proof of following the official Instagram account).

7) Payment Process

After filling in the form, participants are directed to the payment page, which shows the fee, form number, and payment methods. Before paying, participants must agree to the terms and conditions.

8) Payment Verification

If the payment is successful, the system will issue an invoice and provide the committee's WhatsApp contact for confirmation.

9) Registration Complete

After payment is verified, the team is officially registered. Participants will then receive further information from the committee and be added to the official WhatsApp group.

- 2)Phase 1: Rp. 250.000/team (8th - 19th September 2025)
- 3)Phase 2: Rp. 300.000/ team (20th - 28th September 2025)

6. Once the registration is complete and fulfilling all the previous requirements, participants are required to join the EDC participants WhatsApp Group UNAS FEST 2025 that has been provided by the committee at the end of filling out the registration form

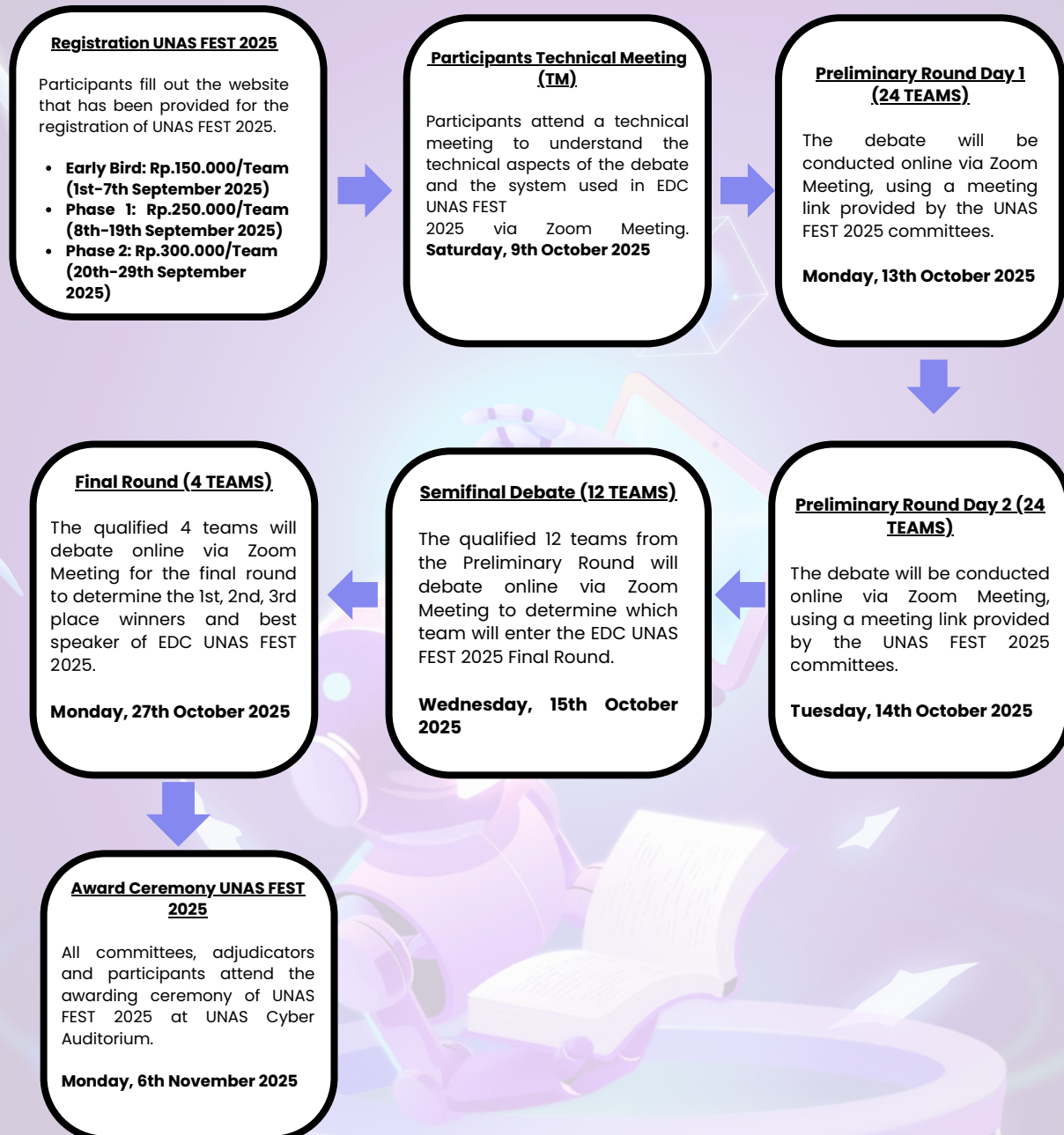


Image 2.1 Competition Schedule Table

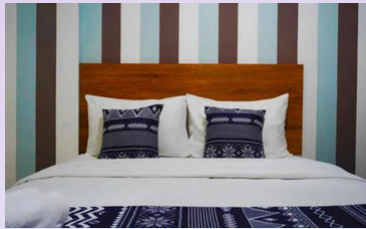

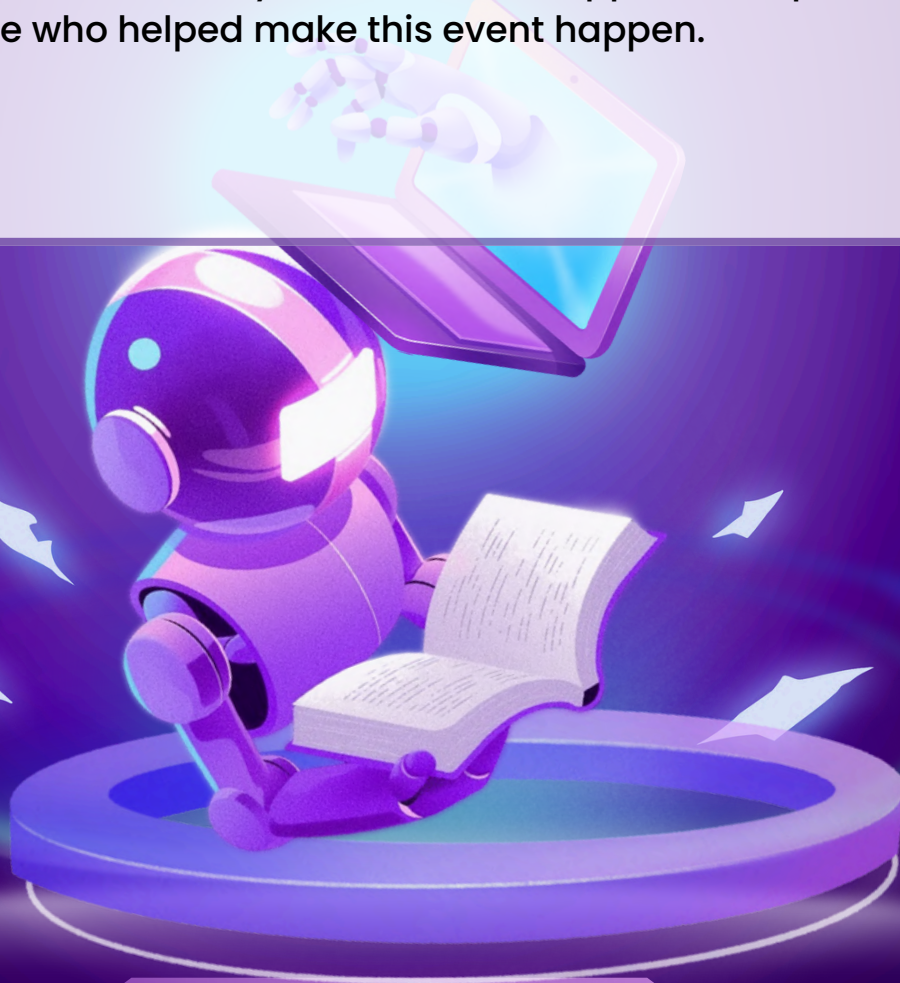


CLOSING
